"My wife and I are long term residents of Ames, and we love the University town and it's close-knit, yet welcoming community spirit"- Simanta



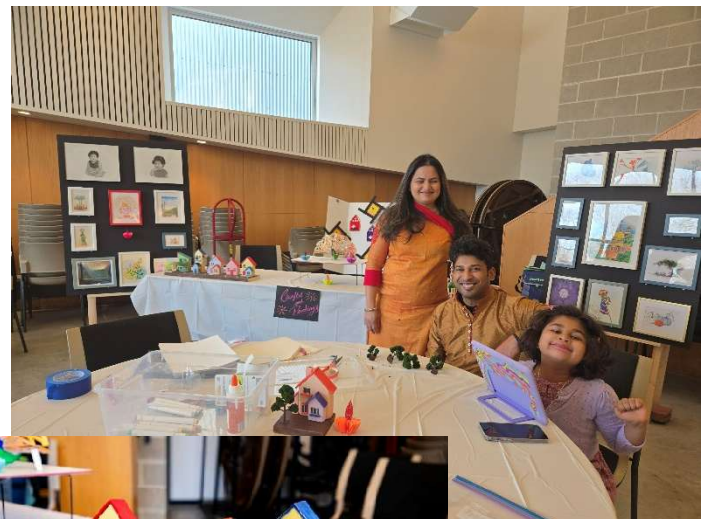
Sandhya Prasad (hosted Henna Art)
